OUT ON THE FARM: NEW LAMBS!



We have several new baby Dorper lambs in the petting zoo at Bundy. They are super adorable! Don't let the word "sheepish" mislead you...Sheep are actually smart animals who do much more than graze around. At Bundy, the sheep and lambs are cared for as companion animals. Sheep form strong bonds with one another, such as those between a mother and her lamb, and other friendships too. Sheep, like goats, have interesting pupils that are rectangular; this allows them to have 270-to-320-degree field of vision. They can see almost everything around them which is useful for watching out for predators, like coyotes. Additionally, sheep can recognize faces and remember them! Sheep have a groove in their upper lip that divides it in half. This groove is called a philtrum. Sheep are very picky grazers, also called *browsers*, and prefer to eat only the best vegetation. The philtrum allows them to select the leaves and other vegetation that they like. Hope you learned some wool-somly fascinating information!
